## Extra Services Offered by KMUD

### COMPOST, & MULCH

**Hours of Operation:**  
Tuesday through Friday  
(excluding holidays)  
8:00 AM to 3:30 PM

Mulch is free

Compost (dillo dirt) is \$10/bobcat bucket (1/2 cubic yard)

### RV SEWAGE DUMPING

**Hours of Operation:**  
Monday through Friday  
(excluding holidays)  
8:00 AM to 3:30 PM

Fee is \$5.00 per 200 gallon maximum dump. This includes 100 gallons of potable water.

### TIRE DISPOSAL (WITHOUT RIMS)

**Hours of Operation:**  
Monday through Friday  
(excluding holidays)  
8:00 AM to 3:30 PM

Smaller than fourteen (14) inch tire and motorcycle, bicycle, golf cart, lawn mower, ATV, etc.—**\$1.75 per tire**

Fourteen (14) inch tire through twenty-four (24) inch tire—**\$2.50 per tire**

**TIRES LARGER THAN TWENTY-FOUR (24) INCHES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

### OIL

**Hours of Operation:**  
Tuesday through Friday  
(excluding holidays)  
8:00 AM to 3:30 PM

Oil without water is free to drop off and the filters are 50 cents each.

Antifreeze, cooking oil, gasoline, diesel, and hydraulic fluid may also be dropped off free of charge.

Oil WITH water is \$1.50 per gallon

### BRUSH DUMPING

Brush Dumping will only be available to **KMUD Residential Customers**. A KMUD bill must be presented for access to the facility.

**Hours of Operation**  
Monday, Wednesday, and Friday  
(excluding holidays)  
8:00 AM to 12:00 noon

The fee is:  
\$2.50/cubic yard up to 50 cubic yards for a twelve (12) month period.

\$5.00/cubic yard over 50 cubic yards for a twelve (12) month period.

### RECYCLING TRAILER

#### **Hours of Operation:**

The recycling trailer is dropped off by Llano Recycle on Mondays then picked up on Tuesday afternoon. It is brought back Wednesday afternoon and picked up each Friday afternoon.

#### **Items accepted are:**

Aluminum cans, Paper, Cardboard, Metal cans, Plastic bottles (Pete Code 1 and 2).

## Grinder Unit Care and Maintenance

**Prevent grease-related sewage overflows: Keep cooking grease out of the sewer system.**

**DO**



**DON'T**



### ☺ **Do**

- ☺ Use an old coffee can or jar as a grease container
- ☺ Pour greasy or oily food waste into the container, NOT down the drain or garbage disposal
- ☺ Allow animal fats to cool or freeze in the container before throwing them in the trash
- ☺ Mix liquid vegetable fats with an absorbent material such as cat litter or coffee grounds in a sealable container before throwing in the trash
- ☺ Run water through your system before leaving for extended periods, and upon return flush the toilets several times and run the water through the system before using.
- ☺ Flush toilets and run water through showers that are not used on a regular basis at least once a week

**Grease is a By-Product of cooking and is found in things like these:**

- **Meat Fats**
- **Cooking Oil**
- **Butter & Margarine**
- **Baking Goods**
- **Lard**
- **Shortening**
- **Food Scraps**
- **Sauces**

### ☹ **Don't**

- ☹ Pour oil and grease down drains or garbage disposals
- ☹ Use hot water to rinse off cookware, utensils, dishes, or surfaces
- ☹ Put food scraps down drains

If you pour cooking grease down your drains, it may build up, block your pipes, and cause rancid odors or messy, costly sewage backups in your home. It can also clog KMUD's lines. In fact, grease is a major cause of dry weather sewer overflows, which are a potential threat to our environment.

And don't believe the old wives' tale about running hot water after pouring grease down the drain: **It doesn't work.** The grease eventually cools, then congeals and coats pipes. When enough grease builds up, it can block your plumbing or KMUD's sewer lines.

If you use large or small amounts of cooking oil, reuse or recycle it. Remember that you can bring your cooking oil to KMUD for disposal. NEVER pour it down the drain.

A metal coffee can with a plastic lid or empty metal soup or vegetable cans make great grease cans. Line your can with disposable heat-resistant oven bags. Throw the liners away (after grease cools) and reuse the can.

### What NOT to Bring / NO!

- **NO** Chemicals of ANY KIND
- **NO** Dioxins
- **NO** Explosives
- **NO** Medical and Pharmaceutical Items
- **NO** Compressed Gas Cylinders (Aerosols & Camp Stove Propane)
- **NO** Fluorescent Bulbs
- **NO** Industrial or Commercial & Business Waste
- **NO** Household products labeled "Caution, Warning or Poison"
- **NO** Petroleum Based Paints, Stains or Varnishes

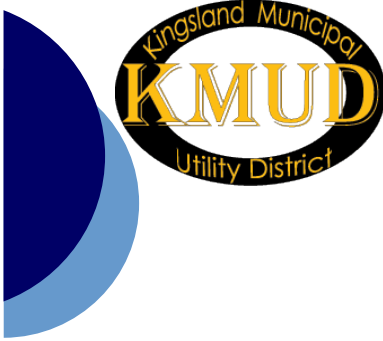
### Guidelines

## Working to Protect Kingsland's Public Health Since 1972

KMUD is a Municipal Utility District (MUD) form of government that was created on December 27, 1972, under the authority, conditions, and restrictions of Article XVI, Section 59, of the Texas Constitution. Kingsland MUD was created to provide sewer services for communities within the District's boundaries. Five Board members are elected to provide oversight of a District's business. KMUD currently provides: sewer collection and treatment, septic system materials treatment, brush grinding and recycling services. A MUD has the authority to levy rates and taxes to construct, purchase and operate facilities for the District's legally defined services. Other functions MUD's can provide include: water, wastewater, storm-water control, garbage collection, road maintenance, parks, fire protection and police services if authorized by the District's voters.
