TIRE DISPOSAL (WITHOUT RIMS)

Oil without water is free to drop off and the filters are 50 cents each.

Antifreeze, cooking oil, gasoline, diesel, and hydraulic fluid may also be dropped off free of charge.

Oil **WITH** water is \$1.50 per gallon

BRUSH DUMPING

Brush Dumping is now open to everyone.
ALL Customers must come by the main office to pay & receive their receipt before they can proceed to dump their brush.

Your Toilet is NOT a Trashcan! Disposable Does Not Mean Flushable

Toilets are only meant for one activity, and you know what we're talking about! When the wrong thing is flushed, results can include costly backups on your own property or problems at KMUD's wastewater treatment plant. That's why it's so important to treat toilets properly and flush only your personal contributions.

Don't Rush to flush any items like:

FOG: Fats, Oil & Grease

A wastewater sewer system works similarly to the circulatory system of the human body. Wastewater flows through pipes, is pumped at pump stations, and is cleaned by the wastewater plant. Over time FOG (fats, oils, & kitchen grease) that are poured down the sink or garbage disposal will enter the sewer system and clog the pipes as the grease hardens. These pipe blockages can send wastewater backwards and out of manholes—onto our streets and into our waterways—or they can lead to plumbing backups on private property. Don't believe the old wives' tale about running hot water after pouring grease down the drain: **it doesn't work!**

Left unattended, these foul-smelling overflows can cause public or private property damage, or environmental problems. In extreme cases, overflows can lead to public health and safety hazards.

If you use large or small amounts of cooking oil, reuse or recycle it. **Remember that you can bring your cooking oil to KMUD for disposal. NEVER** pour it down the drain.

A metal coffee can with a plastic lid or empty metal soup or vegetable cans make great grease cans. Line your can with disposable heat-resistant oven bags. Throw the liners away (after grease cools) and reuse the can.

Our challenging goal is to reduce sewer spills to zero through system maintenance and education. But grease is the number one cause of sewer spills and we won't eliminate spills unless we keep grease out of our drains in the first place.

Kingsland Municipal Utility District has a core mission to protect public health and the environment so that wastewater can be delivered to our treatment plants, cleaned up and then released back into our local waterways.

- **NO** Petroleum Based Paints, Stains or Varnishes

Guidelines

Bring products in original containers only. Do not mix or consolidate product(s). Properly seal containers to prevent leaking. Haul containers and material in the trunk or back of vehicle, away from passengers.

Working to Protect Kingsland's Public Health Since 1972

KMUD is a Municipal Utility District (MUD) form of government that was created on December 27, 1972, under the authority, conditions, and restrictions of Article XVI, Section 59, of the Texas Constitution. Kingsland MUD was created to provide sewer services for communities within the District's boundaries. Five Board members are elected to provide oversight of a District's business. KMUD currently provides: sewer collection and treatment, septic system materials treatment, brush grinding and recycling services. A MUD has the authority to levy rates and taxes to construct, purchase and operate facilities for the District's legally defined services. Other functions MUD's can provide include: water, wastewater, storm-water control, garbage collection, road maintenance, parks, fire protection and police services if authorized by the District's voters.
