KMUD has signed up for Texas One Call which is the largest one-call notification system in the state of Texas. It is a fully integrated GIS and one-call system.

By using the One-Call system it will eliminate unnecessary locate requests and it is a cost-effective way to prevent damage to vital buried lines.

In 2007 the Federal Communications Commission implemented 811 as the national 3-digit number for "Call Before You Dig." The effective date was May 1, 2007. With this new process in place many One-Call Centers across the US began to brand themselves with their state name followed by 811. Texas 811 is still staffed by the employees of the Texas Excavation Safety System.

#### What Happens When You Call?

Call DIG-TESS @ 811 or 1-800-DIG-TESS two (2) days before you dig. Tell them about your project including location, address, person's name for whom the work is being done, type of work, how long it will take, as well as any special instructions needed to make sure the right area gets marked. They can also accept GPS coordinates. Texas One Call will tell you which member companies will be notified and you will receive a reference number that serves as proof that you called. TESS Member Companies will mark their underground lines, as they determine necessary, and you will be able to work safely and without delay.



## District Election Cancelled

The District has cancelled the election that was scheduled for May 8, 2010 for three Board of Director positions, which were places 3, 4, and 5. The Directors currently in those positions are Chuck Henicke, Larry Denney, and Lorean Sindelar respectively and all three incumbent Directors sought re-election. No other candidates filed an application seeking to be placed on the ballot. Congratulations to our Directors.



# MEET YOUR DRAIN'S WORST ENEMY!

## NEVER POUR GREASE DOWN ANY DRAIN!

Over time, oils, kitchen grease and other fats, that are poured down the sink or garbage disposal will enter the sewer system and clog the pipes as the grease hardens. These pipe blockages can send wastewater backwards and out of manholes—onto our streets and into our waterways—or they can lead to plumbing backups on private property.

Left unattended, these foul-smelling overflows can cause public or private property damage, or environmental problems. In extreme cases, overflows can lead to pub-

lic health and safety hazards.

Kingsland Municipal Utility District has a core mission to protect public health and the environment so that wastewater can be delivered to our treatment plants, cleaned up and then released back into our local waterways.

Our challenging goal is to reduce sewer spills to zero through system maintenance and education. But grease is the number one cause of sewer spills and we won't eliminate spills unless we keep grease out of our drains in the first place.



## GREASE IS THE LEADING CAUSE OF SEWER OVERFLOWS!

### Do

- ↘ Use an old coffee can or jar as a grease container
- ↘ Pour greasy or oily food waste into the container, NOT down the drain or garbage disposal
- ↘ Allow animal fats to cool or freeze in the container before throwing them in the trash
- ↘ Mix liquid vegetable fats with an absorbent material such as cat litter or coffee grounds in a sealable container before throwing in the trash



### X Do Not

- X Pour oil and grease down drains or garbage disposals
- X Use hot water to rinse off cookware, utensils, dishes, or surfaces
- X Put food scraps down drains

## Extra Services Offered by KMUD

### RECYCLING TRAILER

**Hours of Operation:**

The recycling trailer is dropped off on Mondays and picked up each Friday afternoon. Items accepted are:

Aluminum cans, Paper, Cardboard, Metal cans, Plastic bottles (Pete Code 1 and 2). **NO GLASS!**

The Recycling Trailer no longer takes appliances. Please contact Hill Country Recycling @ 830-693-3667.

Please be neat and if trailer is full bring your recycling back the following week.



### COMPOST, & MULCH

**Hours of Operation:**

Tuesday through Friday (excluding holidays) 8:00 AM to 3:30 PM

Mulch is free  
Compost (dillo dirt) is \$10/bobcat bucket (1/2 cubic yard)

### RV SEWAGE DUMPING

**Hours of Operation:**

Monday through Friday (excluding holidays) 8:00 AM to 3:30 PM

Fee is \$5.00 per 200 gallon maximum dump. This includes 100 gallons of potable water.

### BRUSH DUMPING

Brush Dumping will only be available to **KMUD Residential Customers**. A KMUD bill must be presented for access to the facility. Brush should be less than 4" in diameter and the maximum length is 4'.

**Hours of Operation**

Monday, Wednesday, and Friday (excluding holidays) 8:00 AM to 12:00 noon

The fee is:

\$2.50/cubic yard up to 50 cubic yards for a twelve (12) month period.

\$5.00/cubic yard over 50 cubic yards for a twelve (12) month period.

### OIL

**Hours of Operation:**

Tuesday through Friday (excluding holidays) 8:00 AM to 3:30 PM

Oil is free to drop off and the filters are 50 cents each.

## KMUD Payment Options



You can elect to sign up for the District's ACH Bank Drafts.

This will allow KMUD to automatically withdraw your monthly payment from your bank account (either checking or saving).

These payments are drafted around the 5<sup>th</sup> of each month at no charge to the customer. Contact our office @ 325-388-4559 if you are interested.

You can utilize your bank's online payment services. However, keep in mind when utilizing your bank's online bill payment services that they are still cutting a paper check and placing this check in the mail to KMUD. Your bill is not considered paid until we have received this payment.

## Working to Protect Kingsland's Public Health Since 1972

KMUD is a Municipal Utility District (MUD) form of government that was created on December 27, 1972, under the authority, conditions, and restrictions of Article XVI, Section 59, of the Texas Constitution. Kingsland MUD was created to provide sewer services for communities within the District's boundaries. Five Board members are elected to provide oversight of a District's business. KMUD currently provides: sewer collection and treatment, septic system materials treatment, brush grinding and recycling services. A MUD has the authority to levy rates and taxes to construct, purchase and operate facilities for the District's legally defined services. Other functions MUD's can provide include: water, wastewater, storm-water control, garbage collection, road maintenance, parks, fire protection and police services if authorized by the District's voters.
